



Bernadine & Tom Allesee

Music and Education has always been part of this couple's life. Bernadine and Tom Allesee met during choir practice at Indiana State University, where Bernardine studied Music Education and Tom studied Social Studies with a minor in Business. After getting their Bachelor's, Tom went on and attended Valparaiso University to get his teaching license, and later, back at ISU, a Master's in education.

With their degrees in hand, Bernadine became a substitute teacher and a music teacher, while raising two children, and believe it or not, when the third one came along, she still managed to direct the choir at a United Methodist Church.
