

Kathy Bruyere

Kathy Lee Bruyere was born and raised in Bemidji, Minnesota. She graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in English and Journalism from Bemidji State University. Kathy and her husband Harold, both worked for the University of Wyoming. He is a professor and she was the Director of the Upward Bound program. Throughout her career, Kathy has engaged in various exciting roles, including teacher, journalist, grant writer, and author.

Kathy has four adult children, nine grandchildren, and six great-grandchildren. Additionally, in this newsletter, you'll find two rescue kitties featured as our December Pets of the Month. Minnie and Vinnie have joined their family nine years ago.

In 2014, while living in Nebraska, Kathy and her husband decided to find a warmer place to live. After flying into Tampa one day, they were so captivated by the blue skies and beautiful weather that six weeks later, they returned and bought a house in Port Charlotte. Although Kathy enjoyed a vacation to the Grand Canyon, she considers Florida her favorite vacation destination and is glad they decided to permanently plant their roots here.

One of Kathy's hobbies is Genealogy on Ancestor.com. She belongs to the Charlotte County Genealogical Society. She serves on the board and writes articles about genealogy for their monthly newsletter. Since 2012, she has traced her ancestors back 400 years. She found that three of her ancestors came over on the Mayflower, and eight were witches from the Salem witch trials, the most famous being Rebecca Nurse, her six-times great-grandmother. There is a play about Rebecca Nurse called "The Crucible". Later, it was turned into a movie and a book. Sadly, she was unjustly hung as a witch.

In August 2023, Kathy joined a writer's group at the Port Charlotte library. Although she had never written fiction before, she started her first project in December. Remarkably, she completed a book in just three weeks. She then spent another six weeks refining it. The book, titled A Love Story: No Secrets, No Lies, is a heartwarming romantic comedy. Currently, Kathy is writing a second book with the title, Call Me Maetu which is about teaching English and reading to Southeast Asian refugee youths from 1979

to 1985 who were displaced by the Vietnamese War. They called her Maetu when she was 32 years old which means grandma in Laotian. It was not an insult but a title of respect. The students were part of a federal education project she worked in. The students were from Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia and Thailand.

Kathy was baptized in a Methodist church. As an adult, she joined Lutheran churches. She tried new churches when they (she/Harold) moved to Port Charlotte and found our church when Reverend Teri Jo Crego was pastoring here. She liked Pastor Teri Jo and found her place here among us. She began attending in 2014 and became a member in 2016. She is sad that, since Covid arrived in 2020, the church activities diminished, as well, as the membership.

In the past, Kathy volunteered for several activities at First Pres. She interviewed church members for the newsletter and took pictures. She worked with Sandy Asaro with the Drum Circle. She currently volunteers at the Food Pantry when she can. She likes our quaint church and Pastor Syl's jokes during his sermons. She also likes the church members. She especially admires Elaine and Ambrose Woods, for their dedication at the First Presbyterian Church of Port Charlotte.






Worship Attendance Comparison Chart 2022 - 2023 - 2024 1st Semester




Worship Attendance Comparison Chart 2022 - 2023 - 2024 2nd Semester




Offerings vs Expenses
