



# **Marilda & Claudemir Sathler**

He met Marilda as a teenager when his family moved to the city; her family lived across the street from his. It took persistence on Claudemir's side, but they eventually started dating. They were in a relationship for four years before getting married.

Claudemir was always familiar with hard work. After high school, he took on various odd jobs, including working as a gas station attendant and a delivery driver. In 1998, in

hopes of a better life, Claudemir, his wife Marilda, and two of their children moved to the Boston area in Massachusetts, where they lived and worked for many years.

Claudemir started working at a Dunkin' Donuts store. He began by cleaning and performing tasks typical for new immigrants. Marilda started by cleaning people's houses. As Claudemir's boss recognized his dedication and work ethic, and as his English skills improved, Claudemir moved on to learn different positions within the store to eventually become a store manager. After several years of hard work, Claudemir and Marilda were able to purchase their own coffee shop from a chain called Honey Dew Donuts. This was just the first of four stores they eventually owned and operated.

Even though Claudemir and Marilda retired and moved to Florida in 2016, he could not stay away from doing business. He currently owns a car wash in North Port but is planning to sell it and retire for good this time.

Already in America, Claudemir and Marilda had their third child. The oldest is Andreza, 40, the middle child is Paulo, 37, and their youngest is Bryan, 27. They also have three grandchildren: Sophia 13, Joshua 9, and Athina Ray who will be two months old this month.

One day, they learned about a Brazilian pastor at First Pres and started attending services just over a year ago. They enjoy Pastor Syl's sermons and appreciate the welcoming nature of the congregation. Claudemir remarked, "Everyone seems to be so nice, and the church is very organized." They also enjoy participating in The Chosen and the new Praise and Prayer Service on Thursdays.

Like many Brazilians, Claudemir and Marilda enjoy anything "BBQed" or grilled. They especially like a steak called "Picanha," which is the most popular meat cut in Brazil. Their favorite vacations include a cruise to the Caribbean Islands and visiting South America, but they have been to Europe recently, and enjoyed very much.


