As we step into June, I would like to encourage you to see Juneteenth as important, since it reminds us of a pivotal moment in American history marking the end of slavery in the United States. I see it as more than just a holiday. To me, it is a call to remember the resilience of those who endured enslavement and to renew our commitment to justice, equality, and love for our neighbors. As a church, we must acknowledge the pain of the past and continue to pray and work for a future shaped by God's righteousness and peace.

Besides Juneteenth, we also celebrate Father's Day. Also a special time to honor and reflect on the profound influence that fathers and father figures have in our lives. Whether they are biological fathers, stepfathers, grandfathers, mentors, or others who have stepped into that role, these individuals often shape our sense of security, identity, and values. Their love, guidance, and sacrifices provide a foundation for emotional and spiritual growth.

In the teachings of Jesus, the image of a father was central to understanding the nature of God. Jesus often referred to God as "Father," emphasizing not only God's authority but also His intimacy, care, and love for His children. In parables like the Prodigal Son, Jesus depicted God as a patient, forgiving, and compassionate father, eager to welcome His children home. This use of a father figure helped convey the closeness and relational depth God desires with humanity. On Father's Day, reflecting on this divine example can deepen our appreciation for the fathers in our lives and inspire us to embody these same qualities of love and grace.


June's Blessing Tree Boys & Girls Club


