Happy New Year, **Everyone**,

I've been thinking about the Book of Exodus lately, God's people standing there at the edge of the Red Sea, exhausted from slavery, terrified of what lay ahead, with Pharaoh's army closing in behind them. They had nowhere to go. Nothing but God's promise that He was with them. And we know what happened. In that impossible moment, God made a way. I come back to that story because it reminds me that God's faithfulness has never depended on how strong we are, how big we are, or how confident we feel. It depends on God alone. On God's steadfast love that goes before us.

Friends, I have real hope for us as we step into 2026. I know we're small. I know we don't always feel powerful or impressive by the world's standards. But we are known by God. We're held together by grace. We're bound to one another in Christ. Furthermore, these past 3 years we have been together, I've watched us show up for each other in prayer, in care, in worship, in doing things around the church and the food pantry, in just plain perseverance. Those aren't small things. They're signs that the Spirit is alive and moving among us.

Hope for the coming year does not mean pretending that challenges will disappear. After escaping Egypt, the Hebrews faced many challenges. It only means trusting that God will meet us within them. It means believing that faithfulness matters more than numbers, and that love practiced consistently can transform hearts, including our own. God has always done holy work through small communities willing to listen, serve, and remain rooted in hope.

So, I step into this new year confident not in what we can accomplish alone, but in what God can do among us and through us. May 2026 be a year when we walk forward together — sometimes unsure, but always trusting — knowing that the same God who opened the sea continues to lead us, sustain us, and call us onward in hope.

Thank you to all who participated in making our Sanctuary beautiful for Christmas and possibly the most beautiful in our area. This is a beautiful church with very beautiful people in it.


Poinsettias & Stained-Glass Gifts




PEP (People Enjoying People)


